Landscaping Review and Update

Thirty years ago, the land just south of North Drive was a corn field. This is where 10 of the 16 units of Brewer Farms Condominiums now set. Tim Banfield, the landscape architect for the project, and the other members of the development team planted a variety of trees (maples, pine, crabapples, river birch and more) and shrubs (yews, forsythia, lilacs, spirea, weigela, and more) to make the new properties interesting and appealing to new buyers.

Over the coming months and years, some shrubs will be significantly pruned, and others may be removed. Trees will need to be pruned or removed if they threaten the structures they surround. Edging around the buildings will need to be replaced and extended to provide a border to hold the crushed rock. The goal in all these landscaping changes is to provide a safe and beautiful community, while making the upkeep of the landscaping easier to handle. This will be an ongoing project, as funds are available.
